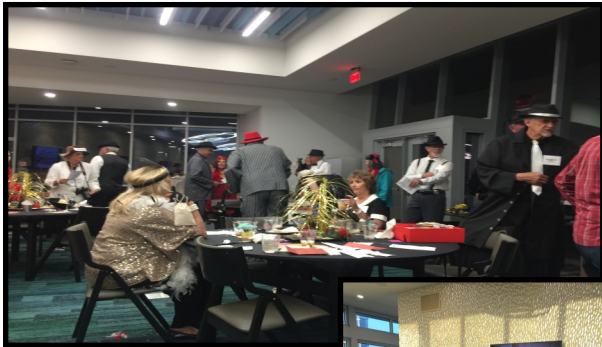

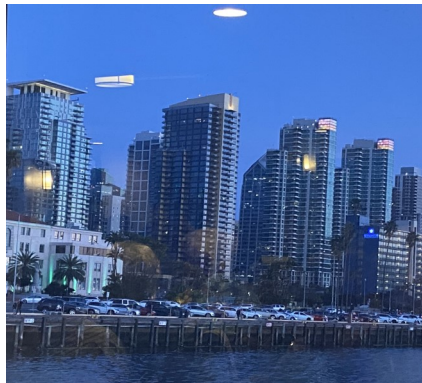


Murder at the Juice Joint

Hello from cyberspace!

Rob Brown your webmaster here. RMCCers.com is slowly learning how to be a better and better place. We use a Canadian Company called Wild Apricot as our website provider currently. Their main market is larger not for profit organizations with club stores or lots of potential for donations. As a result, they focus on events that are much shorter and way less expensive than a motorhome rally. That is why these last couple of years has been interesting for yours truly. They (WA) do not have the ability to set up an event with a deposit and then bill for the balance at a future date. So we have had to trick the website by basically doing one event that was for the deposit and then a second event we called final registration. So far, you the members of Rocky Mountain Country Coachers have done a great job of using the online registration process. Because of your willingness to basically do pre-registrations (deposit) and then a final registration with answers to meal choices and extra days our rally masters have been given a ton of up to date information. That really helps when working with the RV parks and caterers.

Another area of website use that is pretty unique to us is our way of treating Rally Guests. Most websites just have a category for guest at a meeting/event. Since we need to collect lots of information for the rally, we have figured out that by creating a temporary non-renewing membership we can charge the guest an extra fee and offer them the ability to recoup it if they enjoy us and decide to become a regular member. It also has given the membership chairman a way to have special membership drives where we do not charge "extra" for a particular event like the Texas Hill Country Rally. Overall, we, members of RMCC, seem to all be getting used to Wild Apricot and doing away with paper rally applications.

For those of you, who have a co-pilot that wants to get emails directly sent to them so you don't have to forward them a copy of yours, just add their email address in your profile. After you log in, just click on the little orange guy again and view you profile. Once that comes up you will see a big blue button that says edit profile. There you can add his/her email address and you will both get future emails. Happy computing!

Rick Reiss showed the club our 10 year anniversary certificate from FMCA and signed by Larry Erickson.
